Convenient urban location

- Seattle Central is easy to reach from every part of the city. Just minutes from downtown Seattle, the campus is served by seven bus routes. If you live south of town, take Seattle's light rail line to Westlake Center – we're a short bus ride, or a 10-minute walk away.

Academic excellence

- Each year, about 500 students transfer from Seattle Central to one of Washington's baccalaureate institutions.
- Classes are taught by knowledgeable and dedicated instructors. Nearly one-third of our faculty members hold doctorates in their fields, and the rest hold a master's degree.
- Seattle Central now offers a bachelor's degree in applied behavioral science.
