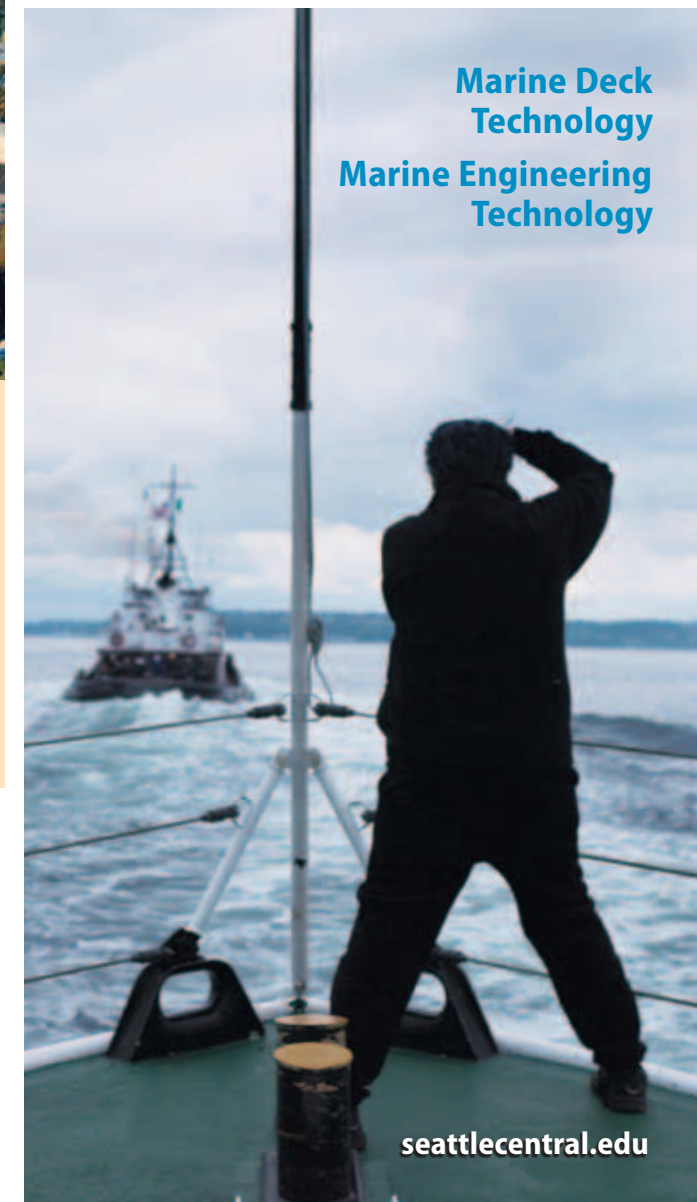

Launch your career at sea

THE SEATTLE MARITIME ACADEMY (SMA) trains students for a career in the maritime industry. Fully accredited by the U.S. Coast Guard, it is the only program of its kind serving Washington and Alaska.

Our students enjoy great success: ninety-five percent graduate from the program and all our graduates find work in the maritime industry.



The Seattle Maritime Academy has two distinct programs of study for those interested in careers at sea:

Marine Deck Technology Learn the theory, design, operation, and maintenance of deck equipment and the applied navigational skills needed to qualify as an Able Seaman-Special. The program also qualifies each graduate for an STCW "ratings forming part of a navigational watch" endorsement.

Marine Engineering Technology Combine practical shipboard experience with formal instruction on the theory, design, operation and maintenance of marine propulsion plants and equipment. Students qualify for an STCW "ratings forming part of an engineering watch" endorsement and as many as six different engine room QMED ratings.

Real-world training at sea

Our instructors are experienced maritime professionals who prepare students via classroom instruction, experiential learning, critical on-water training, and professional development. Both maritime programs conclude with a mandatory 30 to 90-day at-sea internship aboard a large commercial vessel.

SMA vessels

The SMA marina in Ballard's Salmon Bay has an impressive fleet for on-vessel and under-way training:

E. L. Bartlett The 177' 4,000 HP former Alaska Marine Highway ferry has been renovated for engineering and deck operations.

Assertive The 225' 3,500 HP vessel was formerly a U.S. Navy T-AGOS 9.

Maritime Instructor The 82' 1,600 HP former U.S. Coast Guard point class cutter is used for underway training.

Maritime Pioneer The 65' 600 HP tug is used to teach towing skills and vessel handling.

Marine Deck Technology

Certificate, 64 credits.

- Areas of study include on-vessel training, navigation, marine math, vessel handling, and seamanship.
- Job titles include able seaman, apprentice mate, and lifeboatman.

Marine Engineering Technology

Certificate, 77 credits.

- Students begin the program fall quarter.
- The Marine Engineering Technology program may be a good fit for you if you are good at hands-on labor, solving problems, fixing things, working with machines, and would enjoy a life at sea.
- Areas of study include marine math, engineering, propulsion systems, electricity, and machinery.
- Job titles include electrician, oiler, pumpman, refrigerator engineer, and junior engineer.



Employment in water transportation occupations is projected to grow faster than the average for all occupations.

Employment will also increase in and around major port cities due to rapidly increasing international trade.

Tuition

Tuition is set by the Washington State Legislature. Tuition at Seattle Central is approximately half that of a four-year public college and about one-tenth of a private four-year college. For current costs see seattlecentral.edu/registration/tuition.php

Be advised that in addition to tuition, the cost of each program varies widely based on equipment, materials, books, and lab fees.

Seattle Maritime Academy —Directions

SMA is located in the Ballard neighborhood of Seattle.

If driving north or south on Interstate 5

Take the 45th Street NE exit; at traffic light located at top of exit ramp head west on 45th Street. Stay on 45th Street NE for two miles as it heads west towards Ballard. 45th Street NE will change names to NW Market Street. Stay on NW Market Street until it intersects 14th Avenue NW; turn left onto 14th Avenue NW. Turn right when 14th Avenue terminates at public boat ramp. SMA entrance is on the left, near the Ballard Bridge; park along fence.
