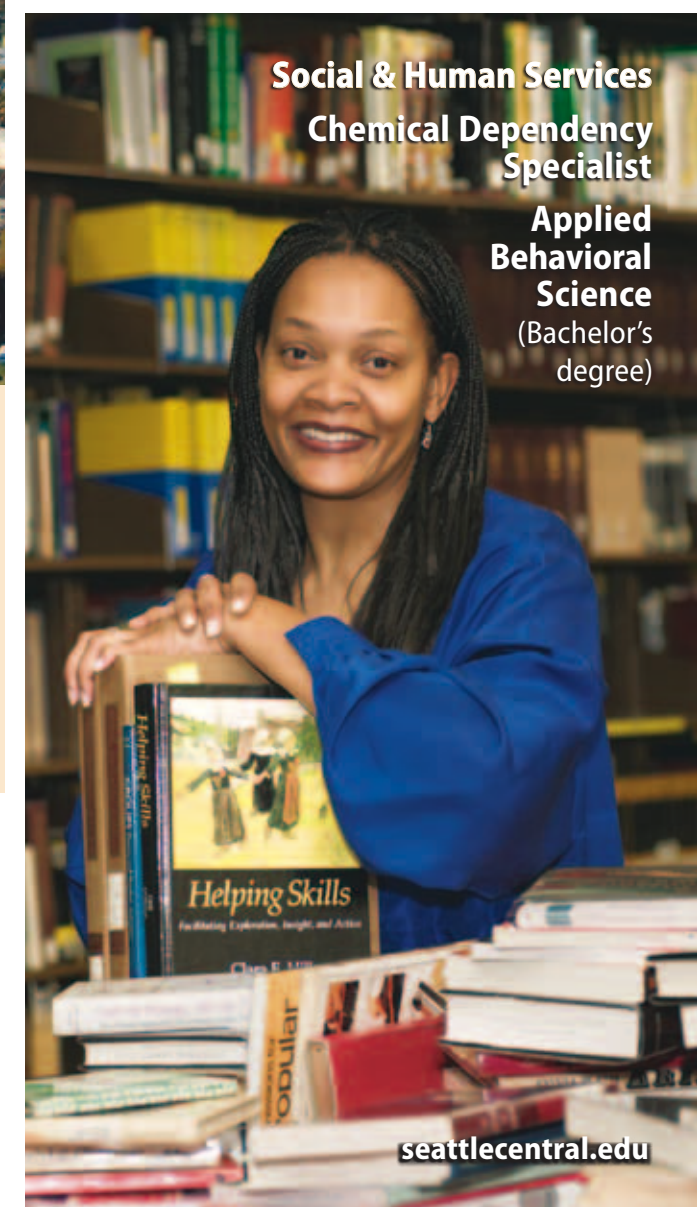

# Life-changing careers

**S**OCIAL AND HUMAN SERVICE professionals work for a wide array of employers and perform a variety of services that target individual clients, underserved population groups, or organizations in areas such as domestic violence, chemical dependency, or homelessness. Demand for skilled social and human services professionals is greater than ever. According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, employment is expected to grow much faster than average through 2016, depending on the occupational specialty.



Seattle Central has three distinct programs of study for those interested in a career in social and human services:

**The Bachelor of Applied Behavioral Sciences program** is a four-year degree for students who hold an Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree. It is designed for students who wish to develop social and human services practitioner skills in a variety of specializations.

**The Chemical Dependency Specialist program** provides comprehensive services to those affected by chemical dependency. Course of study meets WAC 246-811-030 State of Washington requirements for licensure.

The **Social and Human Services program** trains professionals to provide social services to clients in a wide variety of settings. It serves students just entering the field and students who plan to continue their education toward a baccalaureate degree in human services, counseling, social work or community services.

### **Bachelor of Applied Science in Applied Behavioral Sciences**

**Bachelor of Applied Science (B.A.S.) degree, 180 credits.**

- Students may apply for admission any quarter.
- Applicants for admission must hold an A.A.S. two-year degree (90-credit minimum) in social and human services, or related degrees.
- All classes are evening or weekend.
- The program may be a good fit for you if you are currently enrolled in a relevant associate degree program, work in the behavioral science field and would like to enhance your professional skills, or plan to pursue a postgraduate degree.
- Areas of study include public policy, information literacy, ethical practice, applied humanities and social sciences, and field placement.
- Graduates are qualified to work as behavioral science specialists in areas such as chemical dependency, mental health, homelessness, poverty, domestic violence, and many other specializations.

### **Chemical Dependency Specialist**

**Certificate, 45-70 credits (depending on academic background)**

- Students may begin any quarter.
- The Chemical Dependency Specialist program may be a good fit for you if you enjoy helping people, have good communication and problem-solving skills, and work well with diverse groups and individuals.
- Areas of study include group dynamics, case management, physiology, and pharmacology.
- Graduates are qualified to practice in licensed chemical dependency facilities in the State of Washington; outpatient, residential, institutional, detoxification and treatment facilities; and in a variety of public facilities.



### **Social & Human Services Program**

**Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree, 90 credits.**

- Three certificates are available: Child & Family Studies, Management in Human Services, and Prevention Specialist.
- Students may begin any quarter.
- Social and Human Services may be a good fit for you if you enjoy helping people, have good communication and problem-solving skills, and work well with diverse groups.
- Areas of study include communication, interviewing and counseling, group dynamics and social change.
- Graduates are qualified for employment in alcoholism and drug abuse treatment, corrections, mental health, senior services, developmental disabilities, child welfare, and rehabilitation.
